SHANEEKA: Well, I know how to catch fastballs but I think you should learn how to do this by yourself. Why don't you just read about it in a book?

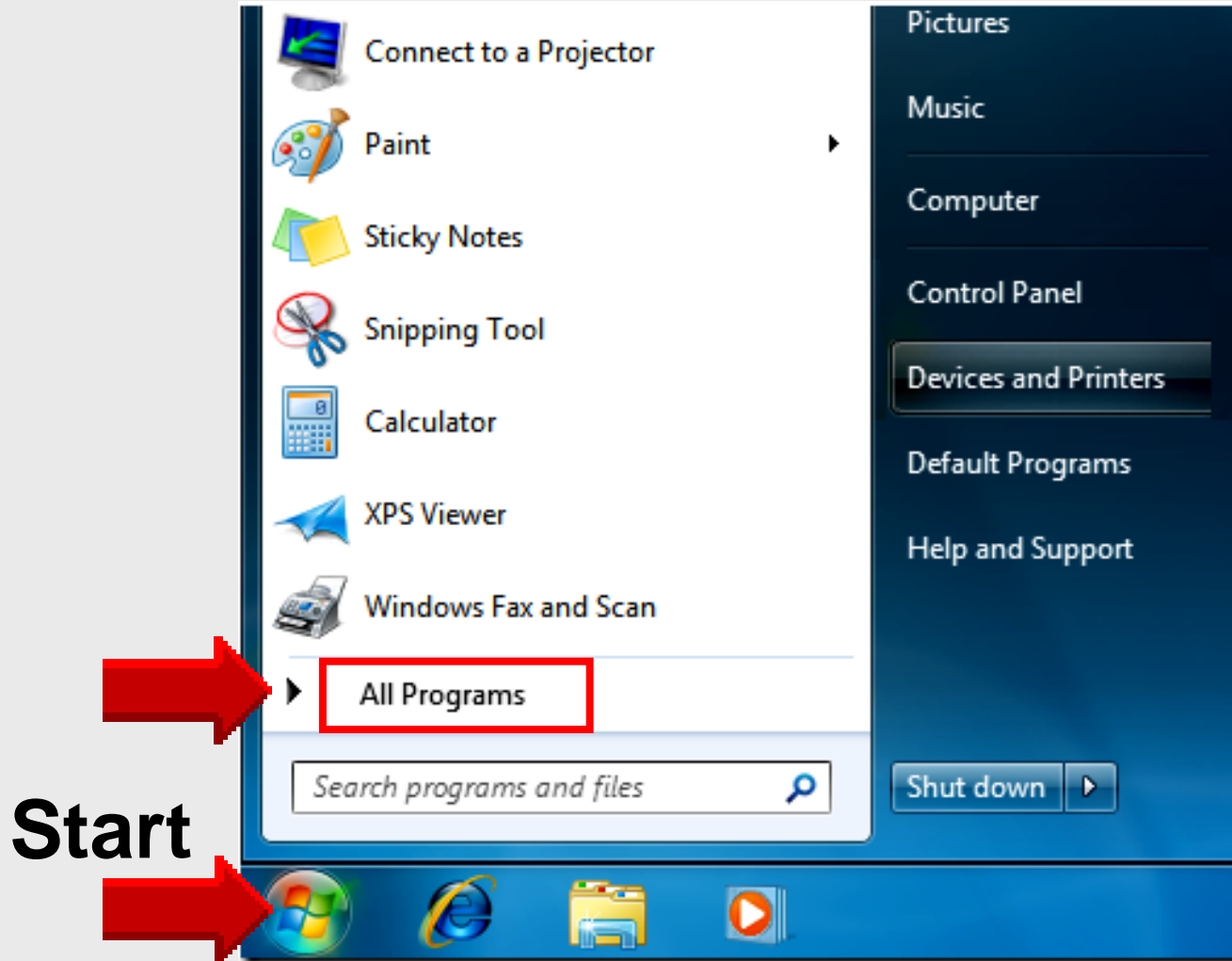
NARRATOR: Poor John. I hope he learned that the only way to have a friend is to be a friend.
