TO TAKE A screenshot, just press the *Home* button and the *Sleep/Wake* button at the same time. The iPad screen flashes white quickly and plays a camera shutter sound. The image will be saved in the **Photos** app, in the **Saved Photos** album on iPad 1, and in the **Camera Roll** album on iPad 2 or above.

Folders

FOLDERS ALLOW YOU to group similar apps together to help save screen space.

While organizing your apps, drag one app icon on top of another. This then creates a folder with both apps inside.

You can then name the folder to reflect the apps it contains. To move more apps into a particular folder, simply return to the main screen and drag the other apps onto the folder icon. You can put up to 20 apps in each folder.





The Fast Way To The Top


TO SCROLL BACK to the top of a page quickly, just tap the status bar. This is the thin black bar at the top of the screen where the current time is shown.

You can also tap the status bar above side columns in apps such as *Mail* or *Notes*.


This is really useful for getting back to the top of your Inbox column when using landscape view in *Mail*.






IN MAPS, YOU can zoom out simply by tapping the map with two fingers.

Magnify Text



TAP AND HOLD your finger on some text to bring up a magnifying glass. Drag to move the magnifying glass around and place the cursor where you need it.

You can also bring up a magnifying box for selecting text. Double tap to select a word. This highlights the text in blue and places a blue dot on either side. When you drag the dots, a magnifying box pops up to give more accuracy when highlighting.

Wi-Fi Sync


IF YOU SYNC your iPad with *iTunes* on your computer, you can do so over Wi-Fi. To set this up, connect your iPad to your computer and open *iTunes*. Go to the main summary page and check the box next to Sync over Wi-Fi connection.

The iPad should now sync automatically whenever it is connected to the same Wi-Fi network as your computer, plugged into a power source, and locked.

If you want to manually start a sync, open **Settings**, tap **General**, and select **iTunes Wi-Fi Sync**. This tells you the date and time of your last sync and the media it's getting from your computer. Tap **Sync Now** to get all the latest content on your iPad.






